5. Thinking skill I chose: Different Perspectives.

However, at the end he realizes that Lemon Brown was a very successful man in the past and was also very caring for his son.

10. Thinking skill I chose: Inferring.
Mrs. Jones wants Roger to learn about trust – she leaves him alone with her purse, showing him that she trusts him not to steal her purse and run away. She shows him without teaching that he can choose to change his life at any time. Moreover, she tells him about her past and the wrong choices she had made when she was younger – through this shared experience Mrs. Jones also teaches Roger about making the right choices and the freedom he has to change his life at any time.

11. George Eliot lived in a society where there is poverty and hardship for many people. The poem shows how people can help others who are less lucky. It says that a person can help others and make them feel better by doing or saying something helpful or even just with a kind look. However, people who don't care or do anything to make life better for others each day are wasting their own lives, and can count that day lost.
12. The quote talks about rejecting people who are different from us. In the story, the narrator dislikes Mr. Kelada and suspects him from the beginning just because he looks and behaves different. He does not like or want his company and suspects his motives even when Mr. Kelada is reaching out to him and trying to be his friend, such as when he offered him alcohol or reserved a place at the table for him. Only when the narrator realizes that Mr. Kelada was willing to give up his honor to protect Mrs. Ramsey's, he understand that his suspicion of Mr. Kelada was unjustified all along.
13. The quote describes the social issues that Bernard Malamud writes about, and indeed they are all reflected in the story. George lives in a poor immigrant neighborhood, he is uneducated and wastes his time reading pop magazines – therefore, he cannot see a way to achieve his dreams of a better life for himself. He also doesn't work and because of that he feels worthless. Only when the rumor spreads that he is reading a hundred books does he gain respect from his neighbors. Mr. Cattanzara wants George to educate himself in order to have the self esteem needed to break the circle of passivity and poverty – because he doesn't want George to end up like most of the poor, uneducated people of the neighborhood.
