7. Although Larry never appears on stage, his character is important with regard to Chris. Chris wants to marry Ann and therefore must convince his parents that his brother is dead. Until the letter Ann brings is revealed, Chris has difficulty convincing his parents of this. This conflict remains constant throughout the play as Chris' future depends on the fate of his brother Larry.

9. **Thinking Skill: Inferring**

One of the central themes in the play is relationships between husband and wife. We can infer that Joe and Kate truly love each other and will go to all ends to protect each other. Although Kate knows the truth about Joe's involvement in the sale of the broken cylinder heads, she does all she can to protect him from paying for his crime. She reminds him to "be smart" over and over again because she is afraid she will lose her husband if she does not. Joe loves and respects Kate as well and is protective of her throughout the play. He does not tell Kate about Chris' desire to marry Ann so as not to hurt her. He also won't admit to her that he believes Larry is dead.
